We are excited to welcome you to Science Gallery Melbourne, but before your visit, please take the time to carefully read through the information below.

As with any excursion, the duty of care, supervision and behaviour management of students remains with you, the attending school staff members. It is Science Gallery's expectation that the coordinating teacher has followed the Department of Education (or equivalent) student behaviour and preparation guidance and policy for Excursions.

Science Gallery Melbourne is an inclusive, public space. We welcome people from all different backgrounds and ask that teachers ensure students remain respectful of both the space and everyone in it, including our staff, during all learning programs.

If student behaviour becomes inappropriate or culturally, psychologically or physically unsafe, Science Gallery Melbourne reserves the right to terminate an excursion.

Does your visit include an Indigenous STEM Learning Program?

Indigenous STEM Learning Programs are co-designed and facilitated by a team of Indigenous university student facilitators. As part of our ongoing cultural safety framework, we require school coordinators organising a Science Gallery Melbourne excursion or incursion to read, acknowledge and ensure that attending school staff members and students adhere to clear expectations during Indigenous STEM Learning Programs.
